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Top 5 Tips for Music Practice

- 1. **Grab a few minutes wherever you can** a few minutes is better than none! (When dinner is cooking, when waiting for everyone to be ready, during a TV ad break!)
- 2. **Practice small sections of your music**, do not just play it through. We are all culprits of this but as tempting as it may be, it is better practice to take a challenging 2-4 bars and play it correctly 5x than play the whole piece.
- 3. **Warm up well**. Warm ups can do as much good as practicing a piece if you do it right. Why not play a slow scale working on tone? What about playing with dynamic variation on a long note? How about tonguing? Find a couple warm ups that tackle these areas and you will have started your practice really strongly.
- 4. **Set a goal each practice**. It is much more effective to have a goal to reach each practice rather than playing without a clear aim.
- 5. **Write on your music!** Please please annotate your music circle that note you keep getting wrong, write in the definition of words, use highlight strips/ pens to highlight the hardest passages. Do not be afraid of writing on the music if it helps you (some of the best musicians' music looks like the picture above!).
